Juan Elvira Zagoya is a fourth year Sacred Literature student at Colegio Biblico. He came from the city of Texcoco located in the state of Mexico near Mexico City. When Juan was 17 years old, his father received Jesus as Lord and Savior and was the first one to talk to him about God's word, but he was not interested. Ten years later, at 27 years of age, someone else talked to him about the Lord. He started to read the Bible and surrendered his life to Jesus and was baptized. Juan joined the Christian Church in Chicoloapan, Mexico where he matured in the Lord through Bible study and involvement in church activities, especially evangelism. It was then when one of the church elders talked to him about Colegio Biblico. Juan decided to enroll at Colegio to get better prepared for Christian ministry. As he approaches graduation, he declares he has been willing to serve wherever the Lord leads him, and when he received an invitation from veteran missionary Gil Contreras to go to Guatemala, he accepted immediately realizing that it was God who was calling him to serve in that country. Juan admits that now he has more tools, and sharper ones, to serve more efficiently in ministry. Upon graduation, he will move to the town of San Rafael located about three hours away from Guatemala City. He will be teaching literacy classes to adults from rural areas and will use this as an opportunity to introduce them to the gospel of Jesus Christ. Juan is grateful for the opportunity to study at Colegio and be prepared to take the gospel message to people who do not know the Lord.

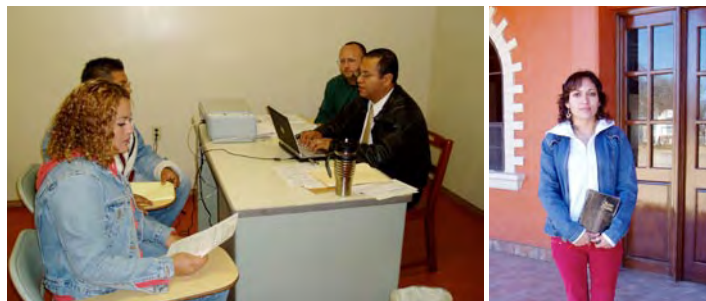
