With a childhood dream of studying and helping others, in his eyes you can see his love for people and for the Lord. At 33 years of age, Marcelino Muñoz from Acapulco, Guerrero, Mexico is a third year Sacred Literature student at Colegio Biblico.

In Acapulco, Marcelino was an active member of First Acapulco Mission, a young church that was started by Colegio graduate Sergio Ontiveros ('96). After a couple years of knowing each other, Ontiveros challenged Marcelino to consider full time ministry but quickly brushed it off.

Not long after that, Marcelino's life started to change. Having to travel often from Acapulco to Mexico City, it was during one of those trips that he thought a lot about his life. Deep-rooted thoughts and images from childhood resurfaced as did his dreams of helping those less fortunate; dreams of showing people how God can transform lives when we allow Him to. This great reality hit Marcelino and he was determined to go to Colegio Biblico and prepare for ministry. The day he turned in his resignation at work, he was offered a bigger salary. Marcelino turned down a good job, a nice house, and the comfort of home to fulfill a higher calling. "We've been through some hard times, but those times have helped me mature and have taught me to empathize with people who have problems. Everything about my experience has taught me to trust God more and more."

Upon graduation, Marcelino, his wife Gisela, and their two little girls plan to return to Acapulco to minister with the local church, but are willing to go wherever the Lord takes them. "I know God has a purpose for everything in life, and He is so good that in following Him, He has allowed me to see that dreams can come true."
